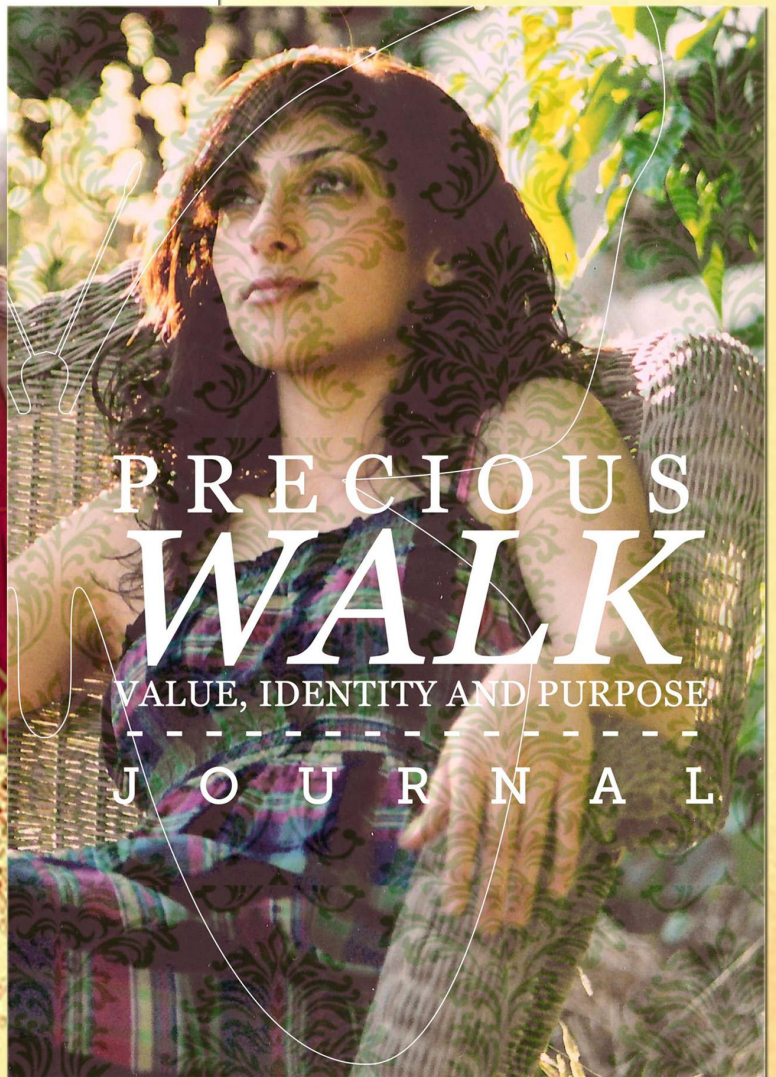

Definition of domestic violence:

Domestic violence is a pattern of terrorising behaviours used to control and intimate a partner. It includes emotional, sexual, physical and financial abuse. A domestic abuser or batterer uses physical or sexual violence, emotional hurt and threats to exercise control over the victim. It causes victims to change their behaviour in response to the abuse/abuser. Domestic violence occurs in all socio-economic, racial and religious groups. Sexual orientation is no protection nor is age or gender!

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

If you or anybody you know is in an abusive relationship, please get help today! If you are in fear for your life or in imminent danger call the police right away!

WARNING:

Domestic Violence is a serious crime - It is against the law! Call 999 The police will speak to you separately from your partner/ex-partner. Their first priority is the safety of you and any children.

WHAT WE DO:

We provide practical, sensible and counselling support to victims. We do our best to direct them in the right direction for getting help.

Signs of Abuse include:

Being pushed or shoved.
Held you to keep you from leaving.
Being slapped or beaten.
Kicked, choked, hit, or punched.
Locked you out of the house.
Abandoned you in a dangerous place.
Refused to help you when you were sick, injured, or pregnant.
Subjected you to reckless driving.
Forced you off the road or kept you from driving.
Threatened or hurt you with a weapon, etc.

HERE ARE SOME FACTS:

On average **2 women per week die** at the hands of their partner in domestic abuse situations.

Between 2009 and 2015, **936 women** were killed by men.

Of these, 598 (64%) were killed by their current or former partners.

75 (8%) of the women were killed by their sons.

Domestic violence or abuse is not love.

It is a crime!

Flee from domestic abuse as soon as possible!

The aim of the JHM Medical Mission Outreach is to provide short term access to medical, surgical & dental care in poor, under-served, overlooked and vulnerable communities in the countries where we serve or have mission partners overseas.

The aim is to improve the health, wellness, and quality of life of the local indigenous peoples who have no financial resources to pay for good quality healthcare or are living in remote areas where medicines & medical facilities are not readily available.

We aim to provide medical outreach in various areas of medicine such as General medical practice, Accident and Emergency, Dermatology, Dentistry, General Surgery, Maternity and Midwifery, Nursing, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Occupational Therapy, Ophthalmology, Pediatrics, Pathology, Physiotherapy, Diagnostic Radiology and other medical sub-specialities.

MULTIVITAMIN SUPPORT



vitamins & Supplements Support Program!

Whats is the MULTIVITAMIN support about?

Vitamins are compounds which are necessary for our normal growth and function, which we cannot make within our bodies and so we must obtain them from our foods. Most of the compounds needed for our body cells to function for our health can be made by our cells from other nutrients.

Vitamins and minerals are considered essential nutrients—because acting in concert, they perform hundreds of roles in the body. They help shore up bones, heal wounds, and bolster your immune system. They also convert food into energy, and repair cellular damage.

Most people don't need to take vitamin supplements and are able to get all the vitamins and minerals they need by eating a healthy, balanced diet. Vitamins and minerals are essential nutrients, such as iron, calcium and vitamin C, that your body needs in small amounts to work properly.

The problem is that poor women and children who do not eat or are not able to afford to eat a balanced diet are nutritionally deficient. Most women from poor and underprivileged communities cannot afford basic food supply. They often go without food and their choice of food when they can afford to are not directed at nutritionally balanced diets or choice. So, they and their families are frequently malnourished and nutritionally deficient.

The consequences are that their immune system falls short and them become ill and susceptible to all sorts of infections, diseases and ailments. For most poor families living under the bread line, who are employed, starving, having access to nothing, living rough or scratching a living, help is required both at home and abroad in order to help them live a healthy & abundant life.

WHO ARE THE TARGETED BENEFICIARIES:

Girls & Women of all ages living in poverty, destitution or homelessness.
Elderly persons & widows.
Vulnerable babies, toddlers and young children.
Pregnant & vulnerable mothers.
People living in homelessness, poverty & destitution.

HOW EXPENSIVE ARE VITAMINS IN AFRICA & INDIA?

Kenya: Vitamin B-12, 1000mg (Ksh 1850) = £13.50/Bottle of 90 pills
India: Vitamin B-12, 1000mg (Rs 1650) = £19/Bottle of 90 pills
Kenya: Vitamin B-12, 1000mg (N6,000) = £12.50/Bottle of 90 pills
South Africa: Vitamin B-12, 1000mg (R 318) = £17.00/Bottle of 90 pills
Zimbabwe: Vitamin B-12, 1000mg (USD 16.33) = £12.50/Bottle of 90 pills
These vitamins cost up to one third of an average monthly wages of most poor people, So they can never, ever afford it apart from the high cost of living. Anyhow, most have no jobs and are poor and many are destitute.

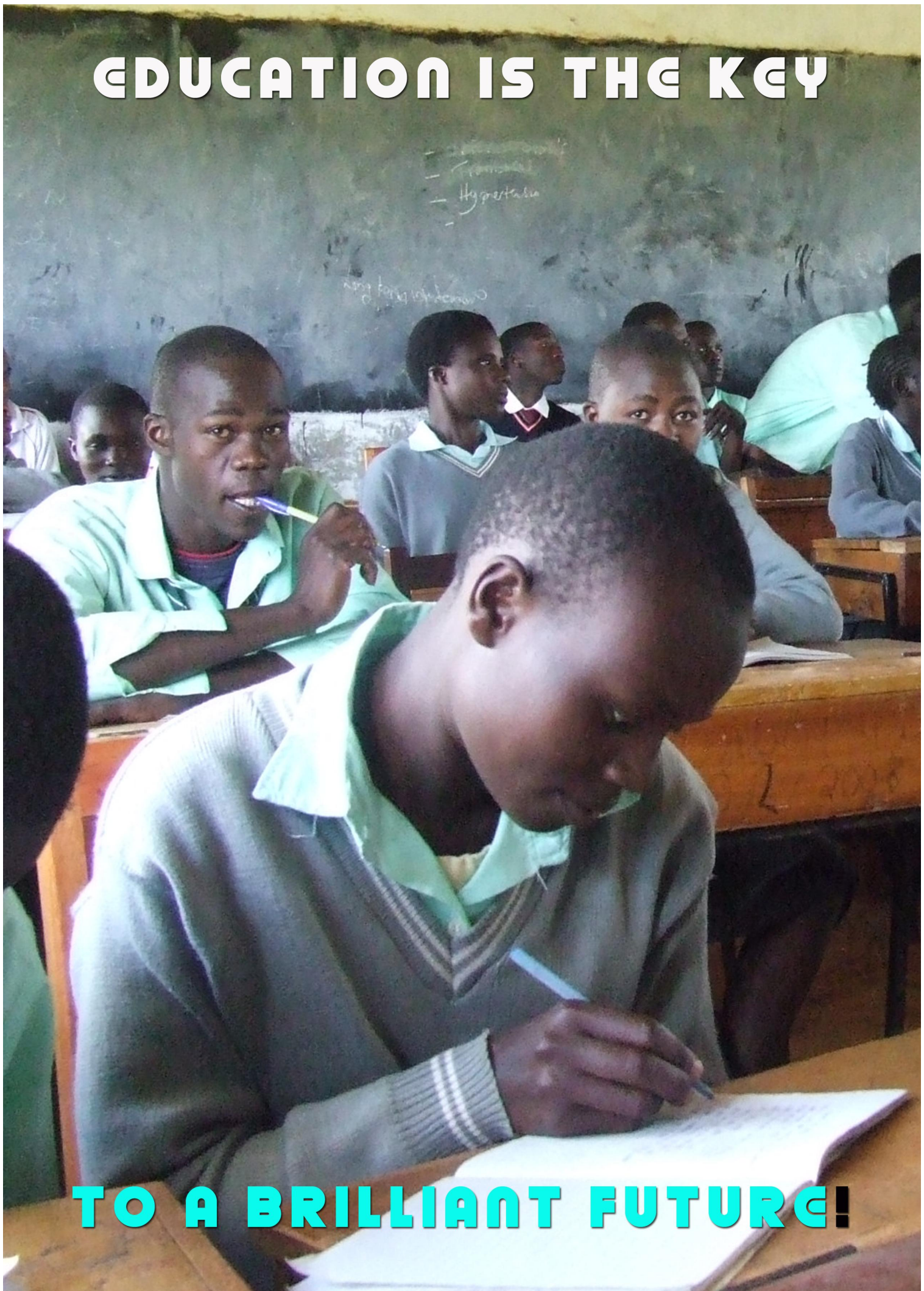

Schools Connect Educational Program

What is the schools connect project about?

Our schools connect project was set up to assist poorer schools in Africa and India to be able to meet their lacking & essential infrastructures need. Many of such schools are run down with dilapidated buildings or having facilities that are in dire need of urgent & serious repairs. Many have no books or library for their students.

Some need new roofs that has been leaking for ages, new toilets for boys and girls, repair of broken school desks and chairs, need to build a library or an assembly hall, buy sports kit, create a safe and effective drainage system, clear gutters and stagnant waste/refuse, help children buy school uniforms, provide books & exercise books/notebooks to children without such essential need or to pay the salary backlog to teachers, etc.

Some schools have no electricity or electrical wiring or have defective wiring, hence they cannot operate computers, fans, air condition systems or light up the classroom when the weather is dark outside. Some have broken windows, doors and some have nothing to shield the children from the elements where there is a storm or heavy rainfall. We need funding, partners, volunteers, helpers and we are seeking those who feel called by God and whose hearts are moved to help, to please join us and partner with us to help these schools in need. HOW EXPENSIVE ARE THE REPAIR COST?

To provide a child with a school uniform: £25-50/Per child

Average cost of desk & chair repair/replacement:£50

To provide books & exercise books/notebooks & textbooks per child:£50-100

Door repair/Replacement:£75-100

Replacing a set of classroom windows: £100-150

Clear gutters and stagnant waste, drainage system: £500

Average roof repair per class:£350-500

FEEDING OUTREACH



Our feeding Program

The importance of the feeding project?

The people we feed in Africa & India are poor people and many are destitute. They depend on the food parcels we provide due to them not having enough to eat in the first place because of poverty, hunger and serious lack.

Many are in desperate need of help. They are visibly malnourished. As such they are vulnerable to infections, sicknesses, and diseases due to hunger and lack of nutrients to boost their immune system. Many exist in apparent hopeless circumstances and destitution. Most are women, single parents and their vulnerable children who have come to depend on these food parcels. As such we need your help to carry on helping them.

Where we currently carry out our feeding outreach?

In Kitale, Kitatale, Mombasa and Mkang'ombe areas of Kenya.
In the remote villages of Kothapalli & Veeralankapalli, Andra Pradesh, in India.

What we provide them?

1. Food bags consisting of bulk essential foods, ingredients, toiletries, etc.
2. Cooked meals on outreach days, enjoyed together as a group of women.

Hunger prevention & other provisions/Support:

1. We provide targeted small microfinance support for those able to start a small trade as we believe that if you can train a mother/woman how to help stand strong on her feet and become financially sufficient, her children will not lack or starve.
We believe mothers are key to preventing hunger within the family, Hence we have developed our microfinance program to empower them.
2. We also give out provision of items of clothing, blankets, hygiene packs, sanitary towels, etc.
3. We also provide basic funds for helping the vulnerable gain access to medical treatment at times of dire emergency need.

Terms of eligibility:

Demonstrated/obvious poverty, destitution or homelessness.
Demonstrated/obvious need, lack, hunger or malnutrition.

Who manages the feeding projects abroad?

Our mission volunteers & helpers on the ground.
Our own staff who conduct the monthly feeding and follow up visits to the needy.

Microfinance & Empowerment

The importance of microfinance support?

Many women in Africa & India live in poverty and are destitute. They are uneducated and have no access to training, career prospect nor have the finance to start a business and trade. Therefore, they languish in poverty unless someone gives them a helping hand, That is exactly what JHM did for **Janrose** (pictured opposite) who having fled from a domestic violent abuse relationship in Nairobi city, fled to Kitale in Kenya with her children but was left destitute, begging for food and in dire need of help and had no money to pay her children's school fees.

We stepped in and gave her the necessary support to get housed. We paid her children's school fees and gave her a microfinance support to rent a shop and start a sewing/tailoring trade which helped her flourish. She also sold soft drinks and little groceries from the same shop. Within a short time she became self sufficient and was able to pay her own rent, support herself and her children and did not have to beg bread any more. She is one of our many success stories. Read her testimony below.

Where we currently provide microfinance support?

To women in Kitale, Kitatale, Mombasa and Mkang'ombe areas of Kenya.
To women in the remote villages of Kothapalli & Veeralankapalli, in India.

What we provide them?

1. Seed funds to enable them to start a small trade or get trained.
2. Business set up & starting entrepreneurship advise.
3. Supervision in starting and running of a successful business.
4. Peer mentoring support & operational support services.

Terms of eligibility to microfinance support:

Must have a demonstrated poverty, destitution or homelessness.
Must demonstrate ability to trade or train for a career/trade.
Must demonstrate maturity, sense of commitment to succeed and be reliable.
Must be vetted through our system on the ground and be recommended.

Who manages the microfinance projects on the ground?

Our mission microfinance staff & team on the ground.
Local accountants and appointed financial advisers for entrepreneurship.

CARE FOR WIDOWS



We are caring for widows & the elderl:

Who are the elderly people we care for in the nations?

They are widows living in poverty, having next to nothing, often sick & hungry people. These are the poor, vulnerable, impoverished and destitute elderly women in need of help, care & support.

Where we carry out the elderly care outreach & ministry?

Jn villages of Kitale, Kitatale, Mombassa and Mkang'ombe in Kenya.
In villages in and around Kothapalli & Veeralankapalli, Andra Pradesh, in India.

What we provide them?

1. Feeding support & monthly food supplies.
2. Essential toiletries including multivitamins support.
3. Regular visits by our ministry care workers.
4. Measured care & financial sustainance as our means allow.
3. Measured/modest assistance with rent & other food sustainance items.
4. Provision, beds, furniture, pots & pans and essential household items.

Other provisions/Support:

1. We strive to provide a ccess to safe dental and medical assistance for the widows and aged.
2. Provision of items of clothing & day to day essentials, etc, when possible.
3. Basic funds to pay rent arrears where/when necessary.
4. We help homeless widows and the aged to find a home to rent & move into.

Terms of eligibility:

Must be a widow/aged living in poverty or homelessness.

Must be identified/verified as a person living in poverty, destitution or homelessness.

Clearly demonstrated need, hunger & lack must be obvious and visible.

Elderly care Overseers:

JHM Ministry appointed care givers, volunteers & helpers on the ground.

URGENT APPEAL:

We ask you to partner with us to keep on helping as many widows & elders as possible in Africa & India. Our greatest challenge is raising enough funds to keep the outreach/mission going. The beneficiaries are some of the poorest widows & elderly people in their communities.
